

Marc Dujardin (°17.10.1957, Jadotville, Congo) is a Belgian architect, option Urban Planning (HAI Sint-Lucas Gent, 1980), Certificate Belgian Ministry of Foreign Affairs (ABOS), Licentiate in Architectural Sciences (ASRO – KU Leuven, 1983), Certificate UN Housing expert (PHSHS – KU Leuven/UNCHS, 1983), PhD in Applied Sciences, Architecture (ASRO – KU Leuven, 2000).

He is a senior expert in Universal Design, Designing for Social and Cultural Sustainability, Interdisciplinary Research by Design, Material Culture, Architectural Anthropology and Building in developing countries. Author of international publications on Architectural Anthropology and Universal Design, visual media (Universal Design awareness creation movies, Post Occupancy Evaluation movies – POE). Extensive experience in the designing and planning of multi-stake holder workshops, intercultural architectural fieldwork, teaching and developing of international education curricula in Universal Design. Extensive international (UN-HABITAT) expertise in planning, design and RHD programmes in developing countries (Africa and Asia).

He is associate professor in the Faculty of Architecture, KU Leuven and research fellow at the Arenberg Doctoral School (ADS), Department of Architecture.
